Parents are required to attend a preparation class held on the fourth Thursday at 7:30 pm. During January, May, and September the classes are held at St. Mary Chardon, 401 North Street, 440-285-7051. During March, July, and November the classes are held at St. Gabriel. Please call the respective parish office to register.

Reconciliation:

The sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated every Saturday from 3:45 - 4:30 pm, or by appointment.

Marriage:

Diocesan policy directs couples to arrange for marriage at least six months prior to the intended wedding ceremony. Please call the priest or deacon of your choice for an appointment to make arrangements.

My Sisters and Brothers,

Simon Peter was a professional fisherman. It is what he did for a living. It was what he was really good at and knew all about, or so he thought. But on this particular life-changing event in today's Gospel, he was coming up empty. They caught nothing. So Jesus, the carpenter, steps in with a totally new suggestion, one that didn't make much sense to Peter and one that he could have possibly even resented. For whatever reason, Peter decided to do it Jesus' way, and behold, the scriptures tell us that he and his partners caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. Life is often like that for us. We think we know what to do, but God has different plans and calls us to use our talents in new and different ways, ways that ultimately build up God's Kingdom. So often we have to let go of what we are comfortable with and think we can do so well, and do it God's way. God's way, coupled with God's grace, can produce tremendous fruit. Try it. It really works.

This weekend we take up our annual in-pew **Catholic Charities Appeal**. Catholic Charities is a very effective way to support ministries outside of our own parish boundaries - ministries who serve people who are most in need here in our community and throughout our diocese. The theme of the 2016 Catholic Charities Appeal is, "**Love Powers Our Mission**". Jesus calls us to make love the action of our lives, not simply the emotion. See this appeal as more than just "another collection", but rather an opportunity to bring healing, love, and transformation into people's lives who are truly in need and far less fortunate than most of us. If you have already been contacted through the mail and have responded, thank you. That is all you need do. Through the good works of Catholic Charities we make it possible to touch the lives of close to 400,000 people. If we are contacting you through this in-pew appeal, please respond one way or another. You need not have the money to put in today, and you can choose how you would like to pay this throughout the entire year. Pope Francis said, "The joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus". Please open your heart and continue to be as generous as you are able. Our parish goal for Catholic Charities this year is \$127,391. We need everyone to do his or her fair share.

LENT 2016! Here we go! With the symbol of ashes this coming Wednesday we are called and challenged to "**Repent and believe in the Gospel**". Masses on Ash Wednesday are at 7:00 and 8:30 (with our school community) in the morning, noon, and 5:00 and 7:00 in the evening. So many people come on this day and begin Lent with the Eucharist - the most important tool of transformation. But there is so much more to do in these forty days. Let me just highlight some of our significant plans.

Thursday is our next **Women's Night Out**. The speaker is Alice Hinkel, retired Pastoral Associate at St. Noel Parish and

an outstanding person and speaker, especially in the area of social justice. These evenings are so beneficial and well attended by the ladies of our parish and guests, and a wonderful way to get Lent off to a great start in this Year of Mercy. However, because there is a meal involved, it really is important to pre-register. If you are planning to come, please call our office TODAY. You will really enjoy this.

Friday we begin our fabulous **Lenten Fish Fries**. These great all-you-can-eat meals continue to get better and more popular every year. Many who go to fish fries around the area have said that ours is the best. But, it is far more than just a great meal. This is another great way to build community and to welcome guests and enable them to experience the warmth, welcome, and goodness of St. Gabriel Parish. So, we would ask three things of you. First, consider volunteering to help out at least one week. Second, come and enjoy the fish fry as often as you can. And third, invite a guest and spread the Good News. Everyone wins, especially those whom we help to afford Catholic education tuition. Sign up online to help. There is more information further in this bulletin.

Please give high priority to our **Parish Lenten Mission** on March 7th, 8th and 9th, given by Father Dom Roscioli, a great storyteller and a priest with practical, humorous, and very valuable spiritual insights. Father Dom's talk will be duplicated each day at 9:00 am and immediately following the 7:00 PM Mass each of the evenings. He will speak at all our weekend liturgies on March 5th and 6th, so you will get an idea of how good he is. I think you will really enjoy him as well as benefit greatly from his wisdom. Also please remember to get your ticket for the **Dr. John Wood/Dynamic Catholic Conference** which will take place here on Saturday, March 12th. John Wood is a close collaborator with Matthew Kelly, and will help us to continue to *Rediscover Jesus*. Tickets are \$20 and available at the Parish Office. Spread the word and bring a friend.

Certainly a very important part of everyone's Lent should be the celebration of the **sacrament of Reconciliation**. Priests will be available to hear confessions here and in every parish of our diocese on February 24th from 5 to 8 pm. Our communal celebration is on Monday, March 14th. "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Make this a fruitful Lent so that you can experience what "New Life" is really all about. There are many tools. Only you can choose to use them. It takes good choices and genuine discipline. Let us pray for one another and walk with Christ through death to ourselves to new life with Him. Peace be with you.

At Christmas, St. Gabriel distributed copies of the book “Rediscover Jesus” by Matthew Kelly to all families attending Christmas Mass. 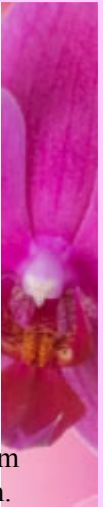


